Momo's visit to Ireland

We were delighted to welcome Momo to Ireland in May for a much-needed rest and for an opportunity for both self-reflection and learning as we look to the future. During Momo's stay we developed a new governance structure – which will give more responsibility to the newly convened governance team. We also amended our constitution which has allowed us to re-register in Liberia as a faith-based ministry. This will allow us more flexibility in how we work. Finally, we amended our constitution and developed an organisational manual that will guide what we are implementing.

Update on Funding

We are in desperate need for funding for 2024. The Koinonia Trust project costs 11,000 euro a year to run. This covers the core costs including all the counselling and mentoring that happens on the ground as we seek to minister to the broken, the poor and the destitute as well as our projects - the football teams, sewing classes and trauma healing. This summer we raised 5,080 euro which was used to finish our administration building and establish the projects for the remainder of the year. A big thank you to all those who contributed.

Update on the Football teams

The Koinonia Trust U- 15 team and U 12 continue to train both on the field and support one another off the field. We are hoping at some point to develop a team near our new compound.

Update on the community sewing class

We are delighted to restart our community sewing class where participants will learn to tailor their own garments. We were able to purchase four more machines and our instructor is our former student.



Update on Trauma Healing Group

Momo is facilitating a Trauma healing group once a week with participants from the sewing class.
